Meet Your 2008 Democratic Candidates – Part 1

Roger Kittelson for Congress

Roger grew up on a small dairy farm and attended the University of Minnesota. He graduated with a double-major in Agricultural Economics and Political Science and later earned a Masters of Science Degree in Technical Communications with emphasis in Agricultural Economics and Statistics. During his tenure at the University of Minnesota, he served three internships two at the State legislature and one in Washington, D.C. He has spent the past 26 years in Agricultural business, two years in rural banking, and 24 years as a dairy marketing specialist; 9 years with the USDA-Dairy Division and 15 years with private food and feed agricultural businesses.

Roger is the father of 4 children; his eldest son is a University of Wisconsin graduate, two sons in college at the University of Wisconsin - Stout and Fond du Lac campuses, and one daughter in Public High School. All of his children attended Wisconsin Public Schools and the three older children graduated from Lomira Public School.

Jess King for State Senate

Jess currently serves on the Oshkosh Common Council, serving on the Transit Advisory Board, Grand Opera House Advisory Board and the Energy and Environment Committee.

A Fond du Lac native, Jess graduated from St. Mary Springs and went on to the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh (UWO) with majors in International Studies, History and Political Science. Jess then received a law degree from the Thomas Jefferson School of Law (TJSL) in San Diego, CA.

Returning to Oshkosh to be closer to her parents, Jess is an Associate Attorney with Steinhilber, Swanson, Mares, Marone & McDermott and serves on the Board of Directors for the Grand Opera House, the Oshkosh Rotary Club, Oshkosh Area League of Women Voters, the UWO Alumni Association, the Young Lawyers Division of the State Bar of Wisconsin, Legal Action Wisconsin, Inc.

Gordon Hintz for Assembly

Born and raised in Oshkosh, Gordon Hintz, 34, attended Longfellow and Washington Elementary Schools, Webster Stanley Middle School, and is a graduate of Oshkosh North High School. While at North, Hintz earned nine varsity letters, was a member of the 1992 Wisconsin State Semifinal Boys Basketball team, and was elected Lieutenant Governor of Badger Boys State. He spent three summers working for the City of Oshkosh Parks Department. Hintz, the son of Anne Hintz and former Oshkosh Mayor, Stephen Hintz (2002-2004) owns a house in Oshkosh near where he grew up. In addition to municipal consulting for Public Administration Associates, LLC, Gordon taught American Government at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh in 2005-2006.

Representative Hintz worked in government at the federal, state, and local level. Hintz received a bachelor's degree in political science from Hamline University. Hintz worked on the 1996 campaign of the late Sen. Paul Wellstone before going to work for Sen. Herb Kohl and Rep. Jay Johnson Washington, DC. In 2001, he earned a master's degree in public affairs at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Hintz worked as a Research Assistant for Governor Tommy Thompson's Commission on State and Local Partnerships for the 21st Century (Kettl Commission). Hintz then was selected for the prestigious Management Assistant Program in the City of Long Beach, California's 5th largest city. He went on to work in the Long Beach Budget Bureau as an analyst on the city's \$1.7 billion annual budget.

In 2006, Hintz won the open seat vacated by 19-year incumbent Gregg Underheim to become the first Democrat elected to this seat in 24 years. Rep. Hintz followed through on his commitment to campaign finance reform joining nine freshman legislators in backing legislation requiring "full disclosure" of issue ads as well as sponsoring a bill providing public financing of Supreme Court races. He has been a champion of funding for higher education infrastructure and programs in the state budget process and supported legislative efforts aimed at economic development in Oshkosh. Hintz serves on the Colleges and Universities, Judiciary and Ethics, Urban and Local Affairs, and Aging and Long-Term Care Committees.
