Why it Matters When Democratic Party Candidates Win:

A quick scan of news headlines and press releases from our representatives show how important our efforts are in electing and supporting Democratic Candidates. Here are a few examples:

Governor Doyle Announces \$15 Million Increase in Shared Revenue for Counties and Municipalities

Governor Doyle Announces \$44 Million Increase in (College) Financial Aid

Ethics Agreement an Historic Win for Good Government

In the first 100 hours of the new Congress, Democrats passed several historic pieces of legislation, including bills to raise the federal minimum wage for the first time in 10 years, expand federal funding for life-saving stem cell research, make college more affordable and accessible, allow the government to negotiate prices with prescription drug companies, and eliminate billions in subsidies for the big oil companies.
